- * Home team decided by coin toss for game 1-3, then by best seed for games 4 & 5
- * Round Robin results will then feed to bracket below. 3 game minimum guarantee
- * All games are 6 innings in duration. Gms 1-3 will have 1hr. 45min. time limit. No time limit on Games 4 & 5.

Tie-Breaker for bracket seeding: 1) Head-to-Head; 2) Runs-allowed ratio; 3) Runs-scored ratio (see definitions below); 4) Coin toss

<u>Runs-allowed ratio</u> - the total number of runs given up in all pool play games, divided by the # of $\frac{1}{2}$ -innings played on defense by that team in those games. Ex.) Team A has given up 7 total runs in all its pool play games & has played 18 innings on defense. Therefore, 7 divided by 18 = 0.3889 runs-allowed ratio. The lower runs-allowed ratio is the better seed.

<u>Runs-scored ratio</u> - same as above except it's a measure of offensive runs scored vs. defensive runs allowed. ie.) the total # of runs scored in all pool play gms, divided by the # of ½-innings played on offense by that team in those games. Ex.) Team A has scored 7 total runs in all its pool play gms & has batted 18 inngs on offense. So, 7 divided by 18 = 0.3889 runs-scored ratio. The higher runs-scored ratio is the better seed. <u>Note</u>: If there is a 3-team tie from head-to-head, use tiebreaker #2, then #3 (if needed) to determine winner. Once winner is in place, then use head-to-head tiebreaker from remaining teams for 2nd place.
